Hello,

It's been really crazy around here for the last 3 weeks. First I wrecked my Prius trying to avoid hitting a kitty in the road. I just got it back after 15 days in the shop. We don't have rental coverage on our insurance, so I had to foot the bill or not have transportation during that time. I can always ride the bus to and from work, but it's difficult to get to the gym and then to work via bus and my morning swim is much more important than money. I had my annual physical last week and my doctor is so proud of me! All of my systems are in great shape and I've really got a handle on the diabetes. I can probably stop the medication in a few more months. Yeah!!!!

The reason I haven't written is because our computer crashed and we lost all of our data. I'm glad you wrote me so I can start collecting email addresses again. If you would, please send me my siblings' current email addresses. It is rather depressing to be an IT wizard and not have a backup of my own computer, so I've ensured that it will not happen again.

Dave got his liver and has been home from the hospital about a week or so. Kevan and I went over there Friday afternoon and ironed out the details of the deal. Dave is not allowed to stay outside for any length of time, or see his grandchildren for 6 months due to bacteria they may be carrying. I'm not sure why we were allowed to be there but I guess adults don't have the same bacteria????????? He will NEVER be allowed back in the lab. Being around all of the acrylic and other lab related substances puts a big strain on the liver if it's not in good order. Anyway, Kevan will take over officially on May 1, although he has been running it for the last several months. He's in on the ground floor of a new denture implant product and is one of the few who knows how to make it. Dave and Dr. Silva (the surgeon in their group) have been giving lectures about this twice a month to other surgeons who are interested. Kevan will have to take over Dave's lectures at some point and it's opening the door to big money for him. The thing about this type of work is that the cost of materials is minimal (about 2% of the total price to the customer), so Kevan is really just selling his talent. Basically, if he keeps doing only dentures and denture implants he will be all right income-wise. If he buys a particular machine he can expand his practice to crown and bridge. He can do crown and bridge now, but has to do it by hand and it takes much longer and comes back for fitting and small adjustments. The machine would alleviate these issues. Any business he brings in over and above what he already has will make him very comfortable financially. He's already dreaming of where he wants to buy a home.

Dear Mother and Daddy,

This is a very difficult email to write. It's 100 degrees outside which makes it even more uncomfortable. However, if I do not get some financial assistance real soon, our lives will fall apart and we could lose a lot, if not everything.

Owen has been unhappy for quite some time now (at least a year) and has tried antidepressants and therapy to deal with his misery. He's very rigid with his diet and exercise and his doctor thinks he's doing so well that when Owen asked to go off his medication the doctor gave him the okay. He did not like how it made him feel and wanted to find the cause of his unhappiness and fix it, not mask it with drugs for the rest of his life. It's not me, or Kevan, or Andy (so he says) that is causing this. His job is stressful, but always has been. Who knows, maybe it will turn out to be a mid-life crisis, although I would have expected that 10 years ago - not now. I do not know if he's discussed it with his folks or his sisters so please keep it to yourselves. Also, please use MY cell number to call me if you can't reach me on the house phone. 925-759-9020 (it's on my business card too).

Three weeks ago Owen packed up and left. We were unable to talk about it at that moment because we were both crying. Since that time we've talked on the phone and he came over once for a few minutes to get something he needed. He told me he had his own apartment near work. He is getting money from somewhere and he has taken more than usual from our joint account. He is putting a very big strain upon our finances just when it is most dangerous. I don't know why it is, but it seems like all the annual bills like car registrations, taxes, and insurance premiums come due around the same time - now through August. Kevan's business is picking up, but he has to wait for the doctors to pay him within 30 days. He does not yet have enough operating capital to pay the rent and buy supplies. We have been helping him with those things and if we stop it would cripple him.

I'm terrified of what will happen when Owen and I sit down to discuss the finances. I don't know what his plans are. It's making me very anxious and I don't even have enough money to get a haircut right now.

What if I need a therapist too? My health insurance does not cover that. All of this and I have not even discussed my own mental state, my ability to cope with this, not to mention how Kevan and Andy feel. My health is precious to me and I'm healthier than ever before. My doctor is very proud of how I have everything under control. But I can lose that control just having stress. I've been testing my glucose level religiously and it seems to be okay, but I don't know for how long. I love Owen. I want him to be happy and there is nothing more I can do for him. I cry myself to sleep every night and valiantly carry on at work. I don't know what to tell people, because I'm not sure of anything other than Owen does not live here anymore. I need \$10,000 in a bank account under my name only. Kevan is so close to complete success I cannot jeopardize that. Andy is almost through with his AA degree and will be able to get a good job. I need some time to figure out how I am going to manage with a lot less income. And I need a haircut. I would not ask if I was not desperate, but I have

I know you're thinking I'm being a drama queen, but it's not funny anymore. With the current economic crisis in America, I can't even get a loan. My clothes are all falling off of me I've lost so much weight. Andy needs some new pants and a couple of shirts so he can find a job - if there's even a job to be found now. Kevan needs health insurance because he's genetically predisposed to diabetes and it's started to affect him. I've been giving him my medication because I have mine under control with diet and exercise.

I'm starting to get scared and have nowhere to turn. Again, the economic crisis in America. I printed and gave your birthday wish to Andy. I told him I could not get him anything for his birthday, because we'll be lucky to have milk tomorrow. He made me cry when he said he didn't care, he understands. Owen calls up all guilt ridden because WE can't get Andy anything for his birthday. What the hell am I supposed to say to that? It's not WE anymore.

He's hurt because they don't call him to talk about what's going on in their lives. Seems to me he should be calling them.

I'm sick to death of struggling, starving, and sleeping in the freezing cold because gas is so high. WHAT CHOICE DO I HAVE? Oh, that's right, no choice at all. I didn't ask for any of this and did nothing to cause it. Kevan, Andy and I are all trying very hard not to hate him, but his stupid, selfish, stubborn actions are very hard to forgive. If he didn't go off half cocked we could have done some advance planning to split up. But no, he never stopped to think about the three lives he ruined by walking out

to be happy. HE'S NOT HAPPY, but we don't ever want him back here.

I have a good mind to write Bill and Billie and tell them the truth. I doubt seriously that Owen did. Why doesn't he ask them for money? Because he would have to tell the truth. Lose face in front of his parents. Disappoint them because he just walked away from his family and his responsibilities.

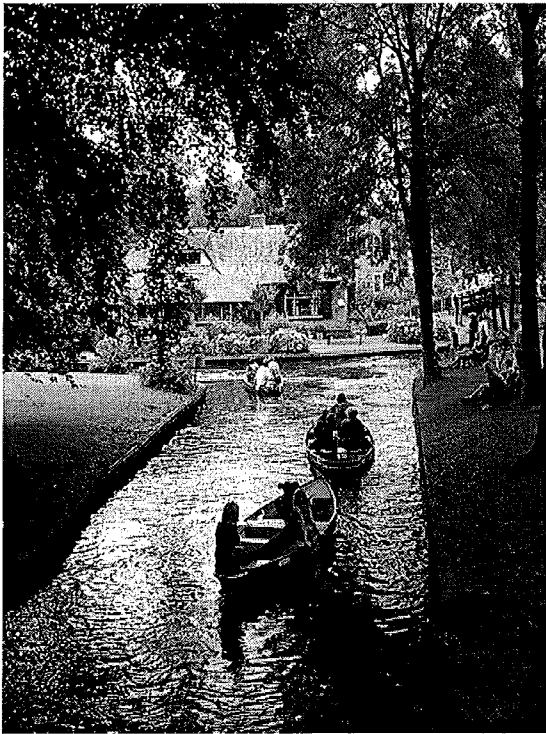

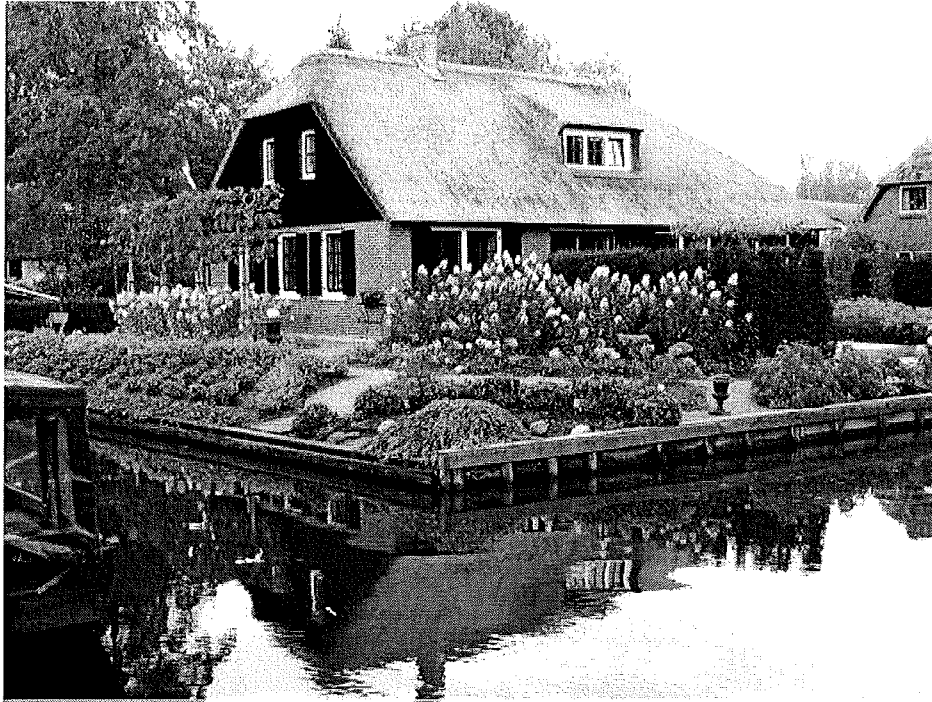

Hey,

We're doing good. Everyone has gotten over the cold or flu that went around. It didn't hit me too bad, but Kevan was down for weeks. We're in for a few more weeks of rain. Very much needed but I'm tired of being damp all the time. The mold and mildew bothers me a lot and my asthma acts up once in a while.

Stuffed peppers huh? First you need to remove the insides and then blanch them briefly in boiling water. These days I would use ground turkey instead of beef, but you brown the meat. If you like onions go ahead and put some in there. Remove the grease/liquid and stir in some spaghetti sauce or plain tomato sauce along with some minute rice. I just "eyeball" the quantities. Add grated American cheese until you like the consistency and then spoon it into the peppers. Put a little more grated cheese on the top and then bake it at about 350. 30 minutes should do it. You need to bake it long enough to cook the minute rice. It took me 2 or 3 tries to get it right initially.

Hope you're avoiding the seasonal illnesses. I just try to stay out of public places and doctor's offices where all the germs are. I'm not a hand washing fanatic, but if you remember never to put your fingers in your mouth you ought to be okay.

Finally I have some new pants that fit. Thank you again.

I understand she complains constantly and threatens the health care workers with lawsuits, etc. Carole said Carl was being given a very strong drug for his agitation which is a symptom of encephalitis. Drina complained about it so now he's not getting anything. Frankly, I think she's the one who caused the misdiagnosis of stroke from the get go. Because she decided it was a stroke she gave him aspirin immediately. This covered up the fact that his temperature was elevated. Hi: I got 3 new meds from the doc yesterday to help my my stamina problems-a nebulizer whihc I haven't receievd yet except the connectand tube, a different inhaler (Cymbicort) which you mayhave seen avertised on Tv. and prednisone which I take just one tablet a day. (I know, I've bem warned by Carol and Robert already about the prednisone but the pulmonary doc knows my condition and I'm sure she wouldn't prescribe it if there was a problem with it). Went to the cardiac doc yesterday and didn't learn too much. They did an eeg, and ekg and took a blood test to test for anemia. So far haven't heard anything. We're having our typical summer hot weather and I can't wait till it cools off. I'm sorry to hear about Andy's car problem. If he finds somethin g maybe I can help a little bit. He needs to have some income. Carl is getting soft foods this week so things are looking up. He's also looking at magazines. I think he's in a really good place. I'm going to see if Robert has time to take me down next week. You don't need to put on a gown or mask anymore. After I know where it is I can drive myself down. I don't think Drina will hire an attorney. If she did I would try to discourage her. I have Nicolas, who helps Suhendras quite often cleaning out beds and he's also going to pressure wash the patio. He's so nice but I don't see how he can work in this heat but I guess he's used to it and I noticed he does have a carton of water. He charges \$14. an hour but for me it's worth it. He' usually does landscaping work. That's about it. I/m glad Kevan is doing o:k. but he's got to keep up with his meds and eat the right meals. I know 2 people who have diabetes and one of them is Vance's dad. The other is a gal I worked with at MAM. She does really well. Glad you have nice weather-send some this way!!!! Love Mother

Kevan is doing well with everything. His blood sugar has been coming down steadily. It's still not where it should be. Never has been. He's going to the doctor today for a follow up. Hopefully the doctor will encourage him to keep up the good work. He has business so maybe he can avoid stress. Stress is bad for everyone, particularly diabetics.

Andy's truck is most likely dead. It probably "threw a rod". I haven't decided just what to do about it. We're looking for a cheap "disposable" car that will run long enough for him to find a real job. I told him we would buy him a brand new car if he gets a decent job and can make the payments.

I was very excited to hear that Carl has started the road to rehab. It does sound like a nice place, but I hope he doesn't have to stay there long. People tend to do better in their own homes. I heard through the grapevine that Drina has an attorney and she plans to sue. Is she an idiot? She needs to focus her attention on getting Carl back together. Based on my limited information she's the one who insisted it was a stroke and failed to inform the medical personnel of other recent symptoms that would have led them to encephalitis. It seems to me they actually saved his life once they realized what it was. 75% of those stricken with encephalitis die because treatment is not started early enough. Carl is one of the lucky ones.

The last time I talked to Owen he said his Dad had had a setback. Apparently he was taking prednisone (?) before his stroke. They stopped giving it to him for some reason and it caused further problems with his mobility. He didn't have much news about Robert and Company other than how thankful everyone is to have them. Billie is getting more and more forgetful and confused these days. I think it's the early stages of dementia. I started noticing it a few years ago. She needs to see a doctor in case there is anything they can do to stop the progression, but she simply refuses to do so. She is very stuck in her ways. The remodeled bathroom is apparently quite nice but has a big shower instead of a bathtub. She refuses to use it and now goes upstairs to use the bathtub/shower.

The weather is fantastic. It's been in the low 70s during the day for weeks now. I've been expecting the few nights of really hot temps but so far - nothing.

Please let me know what the doctors have to say about you and keep up the therapy. It takes a long time to notice any improvement, so hang in there.

Most of it was on the rafters in the garage. Extra boards and stuff. Amy and the kids are coming in tomorrow. She said she was going to paint Carl's room. I think she meant the new bathroom he fixed up. Enlarged it. This street is SO quiet! The only kids I see playing outside once in awhile are the boys across the street. I guess it's just too hot. I'm going to pulmonary rehab three times a week. I'm rather short of breath and it does help some. I'm also going to my cardiologist Monday and will see my pulmonary doc Tuesday. The therapist at the rehub thought maybe a nebulizer might help rather than the inhaler they gave which isn't doing squat!! Talk to you later. Say hi to the boys. Love you'all!!! Mother
